53,000 premises added to NSW construction plan

nbn updates national construction plan

nbn today released its quarterly update to the national construction plan, adding an additional 53,000 premises in cities, suburbs and towns in New South Wales to the rollout of the **nbn**[™] network.

New areas that have been added to the rollout include parts of greater Sydney, Singleton, Kempsey, Parkes, Port Macquarie, Mollismook, Ulladulla and many more.

The construction plan provides an indicative schedule of work to commence before quarter-end December 2016, and now covers more than 620,000 New South Wales homes and businesses.

The expansion of the rollout reflects the company's new, flexible multi-technology approach and is an important step toward connecting 8 million premises to the **nbn**[™] network by 2020.

nbn spokesperson Kelly Stevens said:

"The addition of more than 53,000 homes and businesses is great news for NSW and really demonstrates that the roll out continues to grow. NSW still has the largest rollout footprint in the country.

"Our job is to help bridge the digital divide by ensuring that all Australians can have access to fast broadband as soon and as cost-effectively as possible.

"This is exciting news for the suburbs and towns added to our construction schedule because work to deliver fast broadband is expected to be underway by December 2016."

The rollout of the **nbn**[™] network continues to build momentum; more than 260,000 families and businesses across New South Wales are already able to connect.

nbn is planning to release a three-year rollout plan in the near future, where more communities will be added to the roll out plan, including those in HFC areas.

- **nbn** is committed to fulfilling the Australian Government's policy goal of ensuring all Australians have access to fast broadband as soon and as cost-effectively as possible.
- **nbn's** strategic goals include connecting eight million premises to fast broadband and achieving annual revenue of \$4 billion by 2020.
- **nbn's** current rollout schedule includes all technology in the Multi-Technology-Mix with the exception of HFC and the Long Term Satellite Service. These technologies will be added in a future forecast.
- Your experience including the speeds actually achieved over the **nbn**[™] network depends on the technology over which services are delivered to your premises and other factors outside our control such as your equipment quality, software, broadband plans and how your service provider designs its network.
- The technology deployed in these communities may also change depending on a number of factors once the construction planning stage has been finalised.
- The exact number of premises as well as the regions covered in the rollout plan may vary once **nbn** has finalised its construction planning.
